### COVID-19 Re-opening Plan



### Yellow Phase Per Governor Wolf:

- •Stay at Home Restrictions Lifted in Favor of Aggressive Mitigation
- •Large Gatherings of More than 25 Prohibited
- •Telework must continue where feasible

To this end, the Eastern PA conference recommends:

Worship for Churches over 25 average worship attendance:

Continue holding online worship, recording from home or the sanctuary with participation from small groups of people.

# COVID-19 Plan for Asbury



Yellow Phase: "Be cautious, but enthusiastic" (quote from John Wesley)

- 1. Continue Online Worship
- 2. Maintain Current Staff no staff member has been laid off (due to the help of the PPP loan Asbury received)
- 3. Allow more individuals to participate in the sanctuary
  - a. Add worship leaders
  - b. Singer maximum = 4, maintain 6-foot distance
  - c. Band may be in person maintain 6-foot distance; no singing from band
  - d. 2 pastors to participate
  - e. Continue blended service at 10am
- 4. Anyone in the facility must wear a mask unless just about to perform or speak during the service
- 5. No groups will be meeting in the church building

# COVID-19 Plan for Asbury



- Yellow Phase: (continued)
- 6. Maintain online small group meetings
- 7. Experiment with after church Zoom Meeting
- 8. Pray for "Green"
- 9. Survey to be sent out to give guidance to Church Council for move to "Green"
- 10. Green phase approach will include meeting in person but with changes – the scope of those is still being determined by committees directed by Church Council and Pastor Eric. These will be communicated in a timely manner when we get the "Green" light.

# Vision: Service



Mission and service continues during COVID-19 constraints, once again demonstrating the strength of Asbury.

- Items for the Sixth Street Shelter
- Meals on Wheels route #15 each week
- Handmade masks for Lehigh Valley Hospital and St. Lukes
- Cards and sermon notes to 40 members cut off from technology
- Pastoral care for ill and hospitalized
- Financial support to service organizations
- Uplifting and supportive prayers
- Asbury Pre-school maintained classes online

# Capital Projects: Roof



- Largest project -
- Bids solicited and received January/February
- Bids returned by multiple contractors
- Trustee sub-committee has approved the bids
- Winning bidder was chosen in mid-March and contract has been signed
- Start of the project delayed by COVID-19 restrictions on construction
- With move to allow construction work planned to begin no later than 13-July with a maximum 60-day completion requirement
- Asbury is still working with a consultant for inspection and approval of scope of work and completed work

# Capital Projects: Sanctuary Wall

- Complete Wall repair and pressure wash of outside of building
- Washed and sealed all exterior walls of the church
- Caulked and sealed all building cracks
- Caulked and sealed all areas around the foundation
- Repairs included all water damage and wall damage inside the sanctuary
- Replacement of broken windows in worship center
- Sealant is good for 10 years minimum





# Capital Projects: Garden and HVAC



### **Memorial Garden**

- Retaining wall repair scope has been identified and contractor chosen.
- Contract still being finalized
- Work expected to start by 15-June and be complete by 3-July **HVAC**
- 8 PTAC units and 4 roof units have been replaced
- This will be an ongoing maintenance issue managed by the Trustees
- There is no PM for the PTAC units
- Building closure may have bought some units more time
- BOT is working on a revised HVAC plan for the future that will modernize the system
