Mission and Vision




Mission: To lead people into a growing relationship with Jesus Christ

As you can see our in-person numbers are growing but they are low when compared to pre-COVID 2019. We have been seeing between 40 – 50% of pre-COVID people in attendance at Asbury. Overall low but much better than the church as a whole where many are only seeing 20-30%.

Worship: Attend Worship Regularly



Worship Options:

In-Person:

Asbury has successfully worshiped in-person since February 2021. We plan to continue that into Fall 2021 and beyond. We pray that in-person worship will rebound to numbers at least as high as pre-COVID.

Online: Online worship continues to be a very important format of worship.

Note – Sunday school will take place with 9:15 drop off for children Children's Sunday School through 10:30(end of worship)

Traditional Worship in the Sanctuary: 11:00 am



Worship: Sunday School



Children:

- There will be in-person children's Sunday School
- The plan is for all children and teachers to be masked and follow CDC guidelines to the greatest extent possible.
- Children check-in will take place starting at 9:15 prior to the 9:30 service

Adult:

- Time Start at 9:30am and will be in person unless your class plans differently.
- Please let Asbury leadership know if you need a larger meeting space. We will do our best to accommodate.



Worship: COVID plan - flexibility



In-person worship will have the following guidelines

- Asbury will be following CDC guidelines by state/county
- The Delta variant and likely others to come are real <u>please get</u> <u>vaccinated</u> if you are not.
- Masks will be required indoors should Lehigh County fall into the substantial or high infection rate categories (greater than 50 infection per 100,000 people). Please watch as this can change quickly. We will be in constant communication as this can change quickly.
- Singing will take place but observing any necessary mask requirements.
- No books in the pews, no passing of offering plates, no bulletins, etc.
- Offering will be collected in an obvious location upon leaving the sanctuary.

- As COVID-19 allows we get back to in-person worship and all it has to offer
- 70% of those regularly attending Asbury check in for a service each week
 - > Whether in-person, online, or independent streaming
- Stream and record the sermon to share to a broader audience

- Testimonials taking place in service on a more regular basis
 - > Sharing on various topics that make Asbury meaningful to them


Vision: Small Groups

Summary:

- Thanks to everyone for living their giving plan!
- One time charge to catch Asbury up on UMC Apportionment. This was required to complete the Salem Merger.
- News: Mortgage is changing. Consolidating 2 mortgages into one with American Bank.
- Creating new Investment sub-team to Church Council to watch over endowment and invested savings account. New monies from Salem UMC will be strategically combined with Asbury assets.
- PPP loans: Initial loan from the government has been forgiven. The second loan is still active.

- Projections and Goals for 2021:

 - > Annual budget does not require injection from invested savings
 - Continue to monitor budget using key operating area breakdown (Operating, preschool, AIM, etc)
 - ➤ Re-energize the Endowment Fund and Invested Savings Supervisory Committee
