INTRODUCTION

There is more to your circumstances than meets the eye. Your current circumstances are a chapter. They are not the full story.

Monday: Genesis 40:1-23

Even though Joseph was walking with God, he was still frustrated with his circumstances and he had hoped that the butler would tell someone about him when he was released from prison. In the moment, Joseph could not have realized that this event in his life was part of a bigger story. Is it difficult to imagine the events of your life as part of a bigger story?

Tuesday: Genesis 41:14-49

Joseph proclaims to Pharaoh that he can't interpret His dream, but God can. Do you find it easy or hard to give God credit for your accomplishments?

Wednesday: Genesis 45:3-5

Considering what Joseph had been through at the hands of his brothers, when he finally sees them, he responds in a totally unexpected way – he forgives them. Where are you reacting as expected rather than responding in a way that opens the door for an unexpected outcome?

Thursday: Genesis 50:18-20

- What stands out to you about this passage?
- Given all that Joseph had been through, how could he respond like that?

Friday: Romans 8:28

- With Joseph's story as a backdrop, what stands out to you about this passage?
- What are the implications of Paul's words to all Christians who are navigating adversity?

You have the power to respond rather than react. Use it. You will be better for it, and the people around you will be too.
