INTRODUCTION

Guilt is powerful. Shame can be crippling. We all have things in our pasts that haunt us. We have sin. It only takes a word, a picture, or a name to bring it all back. We know we can do better from this point forward, but how are we supposed to fix the past? We can say we're sorry. We can ask for forgiveness. But some of the things we've done hang over our lives like clouds. What can wash away our sins?

Monday: Colossians 2:13-14

Does your understanding of Christianity seem to be about what God wants from you or what God has done for you? During the message, Eric said, "You are trying to pay for sin that has been paid for. Your role is to accept what has been done for you." If that's true, how would it change your view of faith? How might it change the way you live?

Tuesday: Romans 7:15-18

Like all of us, Paul was struggling with sin. Instead of living with guilt and shame, he put his trust in the fact that Jesus overcame sin through his death on the cross. Paul recognized his sins were forgiven. What are some potential consequences of living with quilt and shame? How have you seen guilt and shame affect your life or the lives of others?

Wednesday: Ephesians 4:32

We are called to forgive others because we have been forgiven. Respond to the following questions:
