## **INTRODUCTION**

Forrest Gump is a 1994 movie based on the 1986 novel of the same name written by Winston Groom. The movie tells the story of Forrest Gump, a very kindhearted man with a low IQ. The film follows several decades of his experiences in 20<sup>th</sup> century America. So where does the movie point us toward scripture?

# Monday: John 13:31-34

In the movie Forrest Gump, Forrest's mother says "Life is like a box of chocolates. You never know what you are going to get." We are all faced with various experiences in life that require us to make decisions. The underlying question to any decision we make is: "What does love require of me?" What would the answer to that question be in a decision you are trying to make now? What would the answer be for a major decision you have made in the past?

# Tuesday: Ecclesiastes 5:5; Deuteronomy 31:1-6

In the movie Forrest Gump, Forrest promises his friend Bubba that he will go into the shrimp business with him after the war is over. Even though Bubba died in the war, Forrest kept his promise and started the shrimp business. How important to you is keeping your promises? Do you think it's important for Jesus followers to keep their promises? Why?

# Wednesday: Luke 12:13-21

In the movie Forrest Gump, Lt. Dan invested Forrest's money from the shrimp business in Apple Computer. (Forrest calls it a "fruit company.") Forrest gives a lot of his money to the church and a hospital because "Mama says there's only so much fortune a man really needs and the rest is just for showing off." What stands out to you in the parable from today's reading? Do you have a plan to give some of your resources to build the kingdom of God?

# Thursday: Genesis 3, Galatians 5:13

In the movie *Forrest Gump*, Forrest is asking the age-old question, "is life following a predetermined course? or is it arbitrary?" Based on what happens in Genesis 3, how would you respond to Forrest?

## Friday: Matthew 18:2-3

In the movie Forrest Gump, Forrest has a low IQ and it may lead us to feel sorry for him. But, Forrest is the one in the film who redeems the lives of those he interacts. Sometimes knowledge and sophistication can make us jaded and cynical. They can cause us to lose faith. What do you think Jesus means in v. 3? Do you have a childlike faith or do you think everything needs to be explained for you to believe it?

Forrest's mother says "Life is like a box of chocolates. you never know what you are going to get." We are all faced with various experiences in life that require us to make decisions.
