INTRODUCTION

As we conclude this sermon series, John the Baptist's message continues to inspire us. These final days before Christmas can often be hectic. Between last-minute shopping, cooking and baking, house cleaning, traveling, the kids finishing school and more, there is often never a shortage of things to do. Yet, amid the rush, the Christmas story reminds us to that we are Christ's witnesses. Let us prepare ourselves and invite others to join in the celebration of Christ's first coming even as we continually prepare for his Second Coming.

Monday: Luke 3:4-6

From our favorite restaurant's slogans to our church's mission statement, core messages are those that can be boiled down to a singular idea. John the Baptist's ministry was about preparing the way for the Messiah. All he did along the banks of the Jordan River was to pave the way for Jesus. When reflecting on your own life, how you spend your time, what you value, and what you do with your time, what is the core message you're broadcasting?

Tuesday: Luke 2:1-15

It is Christmas Eve. As we gather to celebrate the First Christmas, I invite you to read Luke's account of Christ's birth. Take in all the details. Imagine yourself as a shepherd hearing the "good news for all people" from the angel. What part of the Christmas account resonates the most with you in this season of your life?

Wednesday: Luke 2:19

One of my (Pastor Rick's) favorite aspects is the inclusion of this verse amid the birth of our Lord. Amid the angelic host's singing, shepherds' visit and more, a quite reflective moment like this - especially from Mary who just delivered baby Jesus - is an important reminder for us too. It is Christmas Day. What are you treasuring today? Take a quiet moment to praise God for this.

Thursday: "Amazing Grace" UMH#378

In this week's sermon, we looked at this well-known hymn. "Amazing Grace" celebrates the conversion of a sinner to a saint. It is a story for you and me. Take time to read through all the verses (they can be found at https://www.hymnsite.com/lyrics/umh378.sht). What verse most speaks to you at this time in your life? Why do you feel that is?

Friday: Malachi 3:10

In this exchange between God and His people, God challenges the people to bring the full tithe. It is one of the few times in Scripture where the Lord invites us to challenge and see God's faithfulness. Reflect upon your life and how God has been faithful to you.
