"Christianity and World Religions: Judaism"

#### INTRODUCTION

Judaism is the world's oldest monotheistic religion, dating back nearly 4,000 years. Followers of Judaism believe in one God who revealed himself through ancient prophets. The history of Judaism is essential to understanding the Jewish faith, which has a rich heritage of law, culture and tradition.

Judaism and Christianity share common ground with many beliefs. The one area of disagreement is the identity of Jesus Christ. Jews do not believe he is the messiah. In spite of our differences in that topic, we need to hold our Jewish friends and neighbors in highest esteem because they are like our older brother and sisters in faith. Too many times in human history, Christians have been silent in the face of anti-Semitic behavior. We should never tolerate anti-Semitic behavior in our communities and we should never remain silent.

#### **QUESTIONS**

- 1. Do you have any Jewish friends, neighbors, or co-workers? If so, have you ever had a discussion about religion with them?
- 2. Have you ever personally experienced anti-Semitic behavior toward Jewish people in your sphere of influence? If so, how did you respond?
- 3. People of the Jewish faith do not believe that Jesus is the Messiah. However, the apostle Paul says that they will always be God's chosen people (read Romans 11:28-29 on page 1.) Based on Pastor Eric's sermon, what does this mean for the salvation of the Jewish people? Do you agree or disagree?
- 4. Read Deuteronomy 6:4-5. How do you demonstrate your love for God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength?
- 5. Read Genesis 12:1-4 on page 1. What does this teach us about God's desire for us?
