Week 5 September 17, 2023 "A Question of Honor"

INTRODUCTION

Even if you did not grow up in the church, you have probably heard the fifth commandment to "honor your father and your mother." Maybe your parents referenced this commandment when you did not obey them. Although this commandment is familiar, what does it look like to honor your parents?

The Hebrew word for honor means *heavy* or *weighty*. This means to treat something as important or significant. Part of what it means to treat our parents as important or significant is to obey them and to consider their needs, their feelings, and what might bless them. However, most Scholars believe that the fifth commandment's primary intent was to ensure people cared for the elderly. The fifth commandment is calling us to care for older adults who have no one else.

QUESTIONS

- 1. How would you describe your relationship with your mother and father?
- 2. Read Exodus 20:12 (on page 1). What do you think it means to "honor" your father and mother? How do you think your children should honor you?
- 3. Read Ephesians 6:1 (on page 1). Do parents ever make demands their child cannot obey "in the Lord"? How important, at various ages, is it to obey your parent(s) when what they ask goes against your wishes, but not against God's teachings?
- 4. In his sermon, Pastor Eric said "The fifth commandment does not apply to you if your parents acted dishonorably and mistreated you." Do you agree or disagree? How should you treat a parent that mistreated you?
- 5. Most scholars believe that the fifth commandment's primary intent was to ensure people cared for the elderly. Who are the senior adults in your life, that you need to care for, you need to bless, and you need to spend time with?

What can you do this week to bless a senior adult? How can this group help?
