INTRODUCTION

In speedreading, the technique is to read rapidly and to pick up main ideas, concepts, or events. Finer details from a slower read may be lost, yet the major themes still shine through. In this two-part sermon series, we explore the major themes that extend from cover-to-cover of the Bible: God the Creator, the goodness God instills in the Creation, God's assistance after sin's entrance, and God's ultimate plan for reconciliation. As we move from skimming to a deeper dive into the Scriptures, the awe of God's work become apparent. Observing the created world gives us reasons to praise our Lord and Creator. Seeing God's faithfulness amid our failings and sins shows us the hope for our redemption. With faith, we move toward the future God is preparing.

QUESTIONS

- 1. What part(s) of Creation are you most drawn to? How does it speak to you about the Creator?
- 2. How do we acknowledge the "goodness" God saw in the world? How might we encourage its expression?
- 3. When we are "walking in darkness" who or what do we turn to? What do we need in order to turn to God more?
- 4. What situation are you most thankful for that God brought you through?
- 5. Can we increase our faith today by looking back on God's faithful plans in the past?

FINAL APPLICATION

What is one step you can take this week to see the goodness in ourselves, others, and the world around us? By turning from sinful ways, we can trust God's plan to redeem and restore us. Let us support others on this faith journey as we look with hope and expectation to the future.
