INTRODUCTION

Many people believe that good people go to heaven. However, according to Jesus, *good* people don't go to heaven, *forgiven* people go to heaven. A question that arises in response to the idea that forgiven people go to heaven is this: "If rule keeping won't get you into heaven, then why all the rules? Why 613 commandments?" In another words, what is the role of rules in Christianity?

God through Moses provides for the nation of Israel a constitution and civil laws, including punishment and rules of how to conduct their lives because they never functioned independently. But these rules did not establish the relationship, when it comes to God, relationship precedes the rules. If your view of religion emphasized rules over a relationship with God and others, you're not alone. But Jesus came to introduce a new way of thinking. God loves you more than he loves rules. We are reconciled to God by grace; we choose to obey out of gratitude.

- 5. Read John 3:17 (on page 1), where Jesus is speaking to Nicodemus, a Pharisee someone who had a passion for keeping all of God's laws. What keywords stand out to you and why? Why would Jesus feel Nicodemus needed to hear this?
- 6. Have you ever wondered if God's love for you was contingent upon your obedience to his rules? If not, why not? If so, why?
