When Athaliah the mother of Ahaziah saw that her son was dead, she proceeded to destroy the whole royal family. ² But Jehosheba, the daughter of King Jehoram^[a] and sister of Ahaziah, took Joash son of Ahaziah and stole him away from among the royal princes, who were about to be murdered. She put him and his nurse in a bedroom to hide him from Athaliah; so he was not killed.

INTRODUCTION

Each Mother's day we honor and celebrate our moms. And no matter what generation you are from, being a mom can be difficult. Throughout scripture we see that there are no perfect moms and we also discover that there were some really bad moms. The Virgin Mary was the best mom in scripture, but even she misplaced her son Jesus when he was 12. So what lessons do we learn from scripture on this Mother's Day?

Being a mom is a really hard job and it requires grace. For those people who have a broken relationship with their mothers, you need to extend forgiveness to your mom, and your mom should extend forgiveness to you. And we don't have to be biological moms to carry out the role of a mom and have an impact on the life of a child. We are all called to be a Jehosheba for someone else.

QUESTIONS

- 1. What is a characteristic of your mother that you always admired?
- 2. Do you think it was harder to be a mother in your mother's generation or today? Why?
- 3. Read Proverbs 31:15-30 (on page 1). Which of the qualities or activities this passage mentions, if any, have you experienced from a mother or mother figure? Are there any of them that you have been able to do for your own or someone else's children?
- 4. Being a mom is a really hard job and it requires grace. Do you or have you found it difficult to extend forgiveness to your mother? Did your mother have a hard time extending forgiveness to you?
- 5. Read 2 Kings 11:1-2 (on page 1). Jehosheba saves the life of her one-year-old nephew Joash and raises him for the first 6 years of his life. Because she poured her life into him, Joash goes on to be one of the greatest kings of Israel. Who have you been a Jehosheba for?
